Useful conversations to have at home:



- When paying for items in a shop, talk about your payment method and explain to your child.
- Talk about how it is important to look after your money and save it, but at the same time it is enjoyable to buy things and pay to do fun things. It is about a balance.
- Talk about how money could cause people to feel happy or sad (e.g. if they won the lottery, they would be happy but if they couldn't afford to buy food, they would be sad.)
- Discuss wants and needs and the difference between them e.g. basic clothing Vs PlayStation 5
- Talk about what they are learning at school and how this could help them get a job in the future.
