

A Walk in Paris - Salvatore Rubbino

3. After that, walk across the Latin Quarter. Situated at the end is the fountain at Place St-Michel, where everyone stops. Take a slow stroll along the riverbank to admire the view of the River Siene.
4. Next, cross the bridge to take you to one of the greatest **landmarks** in the city. Do you know what it is? Look up!
5. Head right, down a small side street near to the water's edge. This will take you past bistros, brasseries and patisseries.
6. Immediately on your left is a strange-looking building. Look at the pipes and escalators that run around the outside of this gallery, the Pompidou Centre, famous for modern art.
7. Continue travelling onwards in order to turn into the main entrance of the Louvre museum. This ancient palace in the middle of a courtyard holds national treasures.
8. Listen out for the sounds of a train - this is your cue to find the nearest station to take the next metro.
9. Do you remember the Eiffel Tower? Take the first left as you exit to face this astonishing structure!
