We Are Learning to:

- Understand how to make responsible choices about having an online identity (what information/images they share online).
- Identify difficulties people may experience online, including online bullying, and know how to block users and report content.
- Identify ways to be supportive to other users online.
- Understand the potential benefits and harm of online communication and how to avoid harmful online behaviour.
- Understand the difference between misinformation and disinformation and the difference between facts, opinions and beliefs.

<u>Useful conversations to have at home:</u>

- Discuss what information your child should and shouldn't be sharing online and ask them what information they share.
- Discuss what difficulties young people may encounter online and how to deal with them.
- Discuss how to block and report content and users on the platforms your child is using (the following parent guide may be helpful: <u>Parental Controls booklet 2024</u>)
- Discuss the benefits and harm of online communication.
- Discuss how your child would know if information online is genuine or not.
