NURSERY ADMISSIONS POLICY

This is an inclusive school, which welcomes children of all backgrounds and abilities. To access a nursery place, parents/carers must fill in a Nursery Application Form. Forms are available from the main school office and can be completed any time after a child's first birthday. Forms are kept on file and parents are contacted prior to a child's starting date. Parental preferences stated on the form may be amended at any time. Children are admitted at the beginning of the half-term after their third birthday, subject to the availability of places.

Eligible birth dates:

A child born between:	Will be eligible for a free place from:
1st April and 31 August (inclusive)	1st September (or from the start of the Autumn term following their 3 rd birthday)
1st September and 31st December (inclusive)	1st January (or from the start of the Spring term following their 3 rd birthday if spaces are available, if not then from the Autumn term following their 3 rd birthday)
1st January and 31st March (inclusive)	1st April (or the start of the Summer term following their 3 rd birthday if spaces are available, if not then from the Autumn term following their 3 rd birthday)

All children are entitled to receive at least 15 hours Nursery provision per week. Some parents may be entitled to 30 hours Nursery provision. Parents can select between three models of provision.

Our session times are:

Start of the Week Full day on Monday and Tuesday from 9:00am to 3.00pm and Wednesday morning from 9:00am to 12.00pm

End of the Week Wednesday afternoon from 12.00pm to 3.00pm and all day on Thursday and Friday from 9.00am to 3.00pm.

30 Hours Every day from 9.00am to 3.00pm

Places are allocated in line with the nursery admission criteria as follows:

1. Children who are looked after by a local authority in accordance with Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989.

2. Children with an Educational Health Care Plan.
3. Children who live within the Stenson Fields catchment area and are due to start school within a year.
4. Children who live within the Stenson Fields catchment area.
5. Children with an older sibling who will be in Stenson Fields Nursery or Primary School at the admission date. Sibling is defined as a brother/sister, half brother/sister or step brother/sister living at the same address as the older sibling.
6. All other children.

Where a decision needs to be made between applications within any category, this will be done according to the following criteria:

- a) The age of the child (four year olds will be taken before three year olds).
- b) The proximity of the home to the school, based on a straight line measurement from the main school gate to the front door of the child's house, as measured on an ordnance survey map.
- c) The date the application for a nursery place was received.

Parents are asked to preference the models of provision on their application form. Where requests for the full day provision are oversubscribed, places will be allocated first to parents/carers who demonstrate that they fulfil the criteria below.

2.5 Days Places Allocation Criteria

1. Parent(s)/carer(s) who have proof that they are engaged on a training programme or further education (this must be the main carer for the child). If training/education ceases then the place may be subject to a change although the entitlement to 15 hours a week will remain.
2. Parent(s)/carer(s) who have proof that they are working full days (this must be the main carer for the child). If employment ceases or the hours worked change then the place may be subject to a change although the entitlement to 15 hours a week will remain.

Please note, where it is felt that attending nursery for a whole day is not appropriate for the needs of a child, the school will request that parents/carers choose model 1 or 2.

30 Hours Full Time Entitlement

Model 3 is available to working parents/carers who meet the government criteria for the 30 hour free childcare. Applications need to be made through <https://www.gov.uk/sign-in-childcare-account>

Every effort will be made to meet parental preference for one of the 3 models. If a child's preferred model is full, they will be offered a place in one of the alternative models. If parents/carers wish to change the model their child receives, they can request to do so and their child's name will be put

on a waiting list. As places become available in their preferred model they will be allocated in line with the 2.5 Days Places Allocation Criteria above.

The number of applications will affect when a child is offered a place and it may be that some children do not get offered a place in the term in which they are first eligible.

The school reserves the right to withdraw a nursery place, where a child does not attend, or where attendance is infrequent. Parents/carers will be invited to a meeting where attendance is a concern and will receive a letter informing them that their child's place will be withdrawn unless attendance improves within the given time limit.

Children who attend the nursery do not have an automatic place in Stenson Fields Primary Community School. Parents/carers must apply for a school place through Derbyshire County Council Admissions.
